Grant Highlights



INTERNATIONAL CENTER FOR APPROPRIATE AND SUSTAINABLE TECHNOLOGY

The grant dollars will be used to retrofit 1,800 multi-family affordable housing units to reduce criteria pollutants emissions. Energy efficiency upgrades include lighting upgrades, tightened building envelopes, energy efficient appliances, energy management systems and on-site solar with storage.



UTAH MUNICIPAL POWER AGENCY

The program will provide rebates to exchange gas powered lawnmowers, snowblowers, grass trimmers and leaf blowers for electric equipment. The rebates will be available to Provo and Spanish Fork residents who have not participated in DEQ exchange programs.



CITY OF COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS

The project will analyze carbon dioxide, particulate matter and nitrogen oxide emissions in three categories within the tri-city region. The categories include municipal fleet vehicles, municipal staff commutes and municipal buildings. The long-term goal of this project is to utilize the gathered data to make recommendations for best practices within the Interlocal Sustainability Action Plan. The final report would provide sustainability guidance for municipalities, businesses and residents across the tri-city region.
