Grant Highlights



FRIENDS OF ARCHES AND CANYONLANDS PARKS - Outdoor Lighting Assistance Program

Friends of Arches and Canyonlands Parks is an official philanthropic partner of the National Park Service. This project aims to upgrade the efficiency of residential outdoor lighting, and reduce energy consumption with dimming and motion sensor lights throughout the Southwest region of Utah. The requested support for the Outdoor Lighting Assistance Program is part of a larger, ongoing initiative of the Friends of Arches and Canyonlands Parks, Moab Dark Skies.



PAMELA'S PLACE APARTMENTS - Grid-tied Battery Project

The newly finished Pamela's Place Apartments in Salt Lake City will function as a permanent supportive housing complex for those in need, with a specific focus on helping people with disabilities. Pamela's Place Apartments is an all-electric, permanent supportive housing facility serving Utahns transitioning from homelessness. The five-story facility adds a grid-tied battery on-site, complementing an existing 29.2kW PV solar array and best-in-class, zero-emission design.



UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY - Tooele County Microtransit Program

Utah Transit Authority's on-demand microtransit service will deploy zero-emissions vehicles in Tooele County and replace six gasoline-powered vehicles used for existing flex route and dial-a-ride services with eight zero-emission electric vehicles, while modernizing existing services with an on-demand microtransit service. The electric vehicles will be ADA accessible, commercially available, 15-passenger vans with telematic systems available to community members.



LOGAN RIVER GOLF COURSE - Fossil-Fuel Golf Cart Replacement Project

In keeping with the Logan City's overarching renewable energy and sustainability mission and goals — including the reduction of carbon emissions — the Logan River Golf Course will replace gas-powered golf carts with electric golf carts. This will eliminate the need for 520.5 gallons of gasoline per year, oil changes, and related maintenance time, and reduce the golf course's dependence on fossil-fuel related energy as well as its carbon emissions footprint.

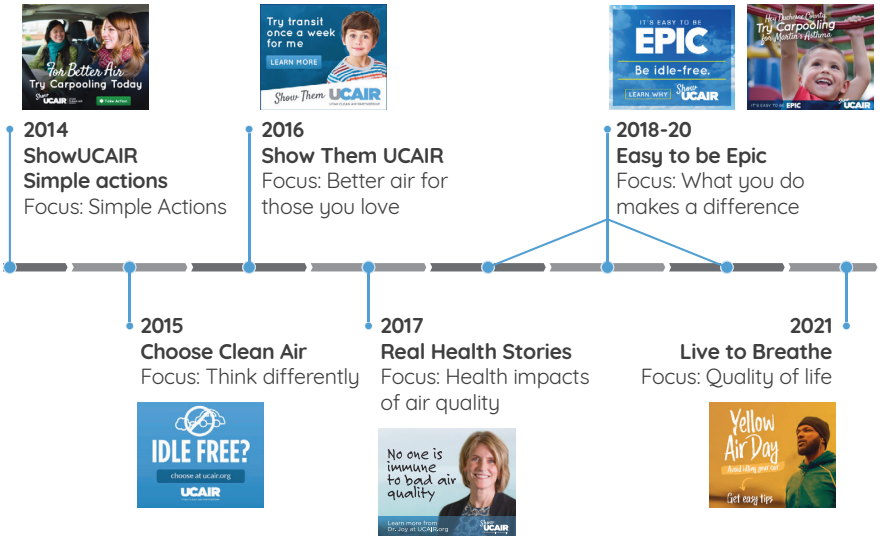
GAS CAN EXCHANGE

UCAIR has worked with Union Pacific, Boeing, Salt Lake County Environmental Health Department and the George S. and Dolores Dore Eccles Foundation to administer an ongoing gas can exchange. The most recent exchange took place October 9, 2021 at the Salt Lake County Environmental Health Department, where Utahns gathered from across the state to replace their old gas cans with new EPA-compliant gas cans to further reduce emissions and promote cleaner, healthier air. UCAIR and its partners exchanged 1,500 gas cans.

CLEAR THE AIR CHALLENGE

In partnership with the Salt Lake Chamber and TravelWise, UCAIR supports the annual Clear the Air Challenge, which encourages Utahns to change how they travel to reduce emissions.
