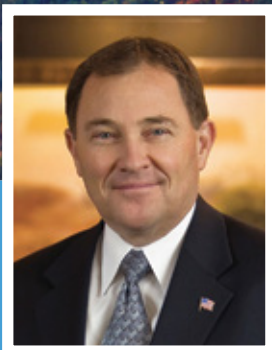

CLEAR THE AIR CHALLENGE/CLEAN AIR CHAMPIONS

Grant funds awarded to Salt Lake Chamber and TravelWise will support the 2019 Clear the Air Challenge, which takes place in February. Additionally, funds will support the Clean Air Champions program, which is a year-round initiative that encourages employers and employees to implement clean air strategies.



AIR QUALITY & ENERGY EQUITY IN SALT LAKE CITY

Utah Clean Energy (UCE) will engage and educate underserved communities about air quality and its link to energy consumption. A bulk purchase of smart thermostats will help reduce natural gas consumption and associated emissions by six to eight percent. The Utah Clean Energy program will provide and install the smart thermostats free of charge for participants who meet income requirements. For participants who exceed income requirements the thermostat will be free and the installation costs will be partially subsidized by grant funds.

PARTNERSHIPS

SNOW BLOWER EXCHANGE

UCAIR worked with Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) and the Utah Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to administer a snow blower exchange to improve air quality. Snow blowers contribute up to three percent of our emissions during an inversion. Utahns who exchanged a gas-powered snow blower received an 80-volt battery powered blower for just \$69, while those who wanted to purchase a new blower without an exchange paid just \$169. Within weeks of launch, 12,325 people had applied, over 20 times the initial goal.

TARGETED AIRSHED GRANT PROGRAM (TAG)

The EPA has awarded funds to the state to reduce pollution from wood stoves through their Targeted Airshed Grant Program. The DEQ and UCAIR used this funding to help residents convert their wood stoves and fireplaces to cleaner options by offering rebates for changeouts. Within days of launch, an overwhelming response from applicants exceeded the goals for the program.

30,000 TREE INITIATIVE

Ecofriendly homebuilder, Ivory Homes has partnered with TreeUtah and UCAIR to plant 30,000 trees in Utah. As part of the initiative, 20,000 trees will be gifted to communities across the state, while 10,000 trees will be planted in new and existing Ivory Homes communities.
